Bill to alter and amend the, as to the time and manner of electing the senate and filling up vacancies in that body, reported 259; considered *341; various proceedings on 563; bill passed as amended 563; sent to the senate 582; returned rejected 681.

Bill reported to change the, as relates to the representation in the House of Delegates from the city of Baltimore 265; bill considered 411; amendment proposed 411-2; and negatived 412; bill passed 412-3; sent to the senate 413; returned, with amendments, which are assented to 505.

Bill to alter and amend the, so that the Governor may be elected by the people, and to abolish the Council, reported 278; considered *413; postponed till May 705.

Leave asked to report a bill to alter and amend the, as relates to delegates to the General Assembly, and to proportion delegation so that no county or city in the State, shall have less than three nor more than four, 284; and negatived 285.
