209. An act to provide for an alteration in the constitution so as to enlarge the number of election districts in Baltimore county, and fix the place of voting.

210. An act to provide for the pay of Jurors in Worcester county.

211. A supplement to an act, entitled, a further additional supplement to an act, entitled, an act for quieting possessions, enrolling conveyances, and securing the estates of purchasers.

212. An act relating to Constables fees.
