THURSDAY, May 26th 1836.

The House met. Present the same members as on yesterday, The proceedings of yesterday were read.

Henry Fowler, Esq. a delegate from St. Mary's county, appeared and took his seat in the House.

The bill entitled, an act to regulate gates in Kent county,

And the resolution in favor of the heirs and legal representatives of George Lashley, a revolutionary pensioner,

Were sent to the senate.

The bill from the senate, entitled, an additional supplement to an act, entitled, an act for the instruction of youth in primary schools throughout this State,

Also, the bill entitled, an act for the benefit of the heirs at law of Henry Wright,

Also, the bill entitled a further supplement to the act, entitled, an act to define and enlarge the powers of courts of Equity,

And the bill, entitled, a further supplement to an act, entitled, an act for the relief of sundry insolvent debtors passed at November session 1805, chapter 110, were returned to the senate.

Mr. Bruff presented sundry resolutions, adopted by a large and respectable meeting of the citizens of Talbot county, in relation to the subject of internal improvement,

Which was read, and on motion of Mr. Bruff, referred to the joint committee on Internal Improvement.
