

Mr. Bayly, submitted the following resolution,
Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Governor be, and he is hereby authorised to direct the Topographical Engineer of the State, to survey the route of a canal (authorised by an act passed at December session 1833, chapter 188,) from some point, at or near Transquin Bridge, in Dorchester county, to the most eligible point of intersection of the Choptank river, and that the Engineer be also instructed to report to the Executive the survey of said canal, and estimate of the probable cost of making it.

Which was read the first, and by special order, the second time, assented to, and sent to the senate.

Mr. Ridgely, submitted the following resolution,
Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Governor and Council be, and they are hereby authorised to contract for and purchase such number of tents and marques as they may deem sufficient for the use and accommodation of the militia when on a tour of camp duty, and they are hereby authorised to draw on the treasurer of the western shore for such sum or sums, of money as may be necessary to defray the expenses therefor.

Which was read the first and second time by special order, and rejected.

On motion of Mr. McMahon, the house took up for consideration the bill reported Mr. Merrick chairman of the committee on ways and means, entitled, an act to incorporate the Union Bank of Allegany.

On motion of Mr. Bruff, said bill was referred to the consideration of the next General Assembly.

Mr. Carpenter, from the select committee, reported a bill entitled, an act supplemental to an act, entitled, an act to establish magistrates courts in the several counties of this State, and to prescribe their jurisdiction, passed at December session 1835,

Which was read the first time, and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Berry moved that the house take up the bill from the senate, entitled, an act to incorporate the Clifton Coal Company;

Determined in the negative.

On motion of Mr. Hambleton, the house took up for consideration the amendments proposed by the Senate to the bill reported by Mr. McLean, from the committee on grievances and courts of justice, entitled, an act relating to equity proceedings.
