

Also, a bill, entitled, an act for the benefit of Hugh Brown,

Which was read.

Mr. Pratt moved that the house suspend the rule, for the purpose of giving said bill a second reading by special order,

Resolved in the affirmative.

The said bill was then read the second time by special order, passed and returned to the senate.

The Speaker presented a memorial of a committee, representing the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal Company,

Which was read and referred to the joint committee on internal improvement.

The Clerk of the Senate returned the bill, entitled, an act to authorise the Governor and Council to build a new Tobacco Inspection Warehouse in the city of Baltimore, endorsed 'will pass,' ordered to be engrossed,

Also, the bill, entitled, an act for the relief of sundry poor persons in the several counties therein mentioned, endorsed 'will pass with the proposed amendments,' which amendments were severally read the first and second time by special order, severally assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

Mr. Townsend, from the select committee, to which was referred the bill from the senate, entitled, an act to authorise James Galbraith, of Cecil county, to sell and convey a tract of land therein mentioned, reported the same without amendment,

Which was read.

On motion of Mr. Merrick,

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore, be, and he is hereby directed to furnish this house with an account of all the bids made for the stock or bonds of the State, disposed of by him under the act of December session 1834, entitled, an act to provide for the completion of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal to Cumberland, and the Baltimore and Susquehanna Rail Road to the Borough of York—specifying the amount of stock bid for by each bidder, and the amount of premium offered by each, and the name of each bidder.

On motion of Mr. Ely,

Ordered, that the committee on ways and means, be instructed to report to this house upon the report of the Treasurer, submitted to that committee.
