

Mr. Merrick submitted the following order,

SATURDAY, MAY 28th, 1836.

The house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill from the senate entitled, an act for the relief of Elizabeth Kennedy, passed by this House on the 2d of April last,

And, the bill entitled, a supplement to an act, entitled, an act to incorporate the Patuxent Company,

Were returned to the senate,

Mr. Duckett, chairman of the committee on grievances and courts of justice, to which was referred the bill from the senate, entitled, an act to authorise the recording of a bill of sale therein mentioned, reported the same with the following amendment,

Amendment proposed.

At the end of the bill insert,

"Provided, that nothing herein contained shall be construed to interfere with or impair the rights of creditors or purchasers, without notice since the execution of said bill of sale,"

Which was read and adopted.

The said bill was then read the first and second time by special order, passed with the proposed amendment, and returned to the senate.
