Mr Miller presented a petition of sundry citizens of Kent county, praying a repeal of the Magistrates Courts law, passed December session 1835,

Which was read and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Fiery presented a petition of sundry citizens of Washington county, praying the passage of a law to authorise persons practicing medicine under the Thompsonian system, to charge for their services and medicine,

Which was read—and,

On motion of Mr. Townsend, ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Pratt submitted the following resolution,

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby authorised and empowered, to borrow temporarily, on the credit of the State, such sum, as in his opinion, will be necessary to defray the current expenses of the Treasury, not to exceed in all, fifty thousand dollars,

Which was read the first and second time by special order—and,

On motion of Mr. Heard, referred to the committee on ways and means.

The Clerk of the Senate returned the bill, entitled, an act to quiet the titles of certain citizens of Frederick county, endorsed, 'will pass,' ordered to be engrossed,

Also, the bill, entitled, an act relating to equity proceedings, endorsed, 'second amendment receded from,' ordered to be engrossed,

Also, the resolution in favor of the heirs and legal representatives of George Lashley, a revolutionary pensioner,

Also, the resolution authorising the Governor to direct the Topographical Engineer of the State to survey the route of a Canal, authorised by an act passed at December session 1833, severally endorsed, 'assented to,' and ordered to be engrossed,
