

The bill, entitled, an act for the relief of the President and Directors of the Conococheague Bank,

Which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. McLean, from the committee on corporations, to which was referred the bill from the senate, entitled, an act to incorporate the Deer Creek Navigation Company, reported the same with the following amendments,

Amendments proposed,

Add the following as additional sections:

Sec. 16. And be it enacted, that any person owning of a mill or other property on the said creek, that would be injured by the said Navigation Company, may take stock to the amount of their aforesaid damages respectively, to be ascertained by commissioners to be appointed by said company, and upon their accepting of said valuation in stock, they shall be entitled to all the rights and privileges of original stockholders.

And be it enacted, that the said Company may connect its works with those of any other Canal or Rail Road Company, incorporated, or to be incorporated by this State, and under such covenants and stipulations as to the companies respectively may seem proper, and such Canal and Rail Road Companies are hereby authorized to enter into any covenants and stipulations as aforesaid with said Deer Creek Navigation Company,

Which were read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

On motion of Mr. Burchenal, the house took up for consideration the bill reported by Mr. Carpenter, from the select committee, entitled, an act supplemental to an act, entitled, an act to establish Magistrate's Courts in the several counties of this State, and to prescribe their jurisdiction, passed at December session 1835,—and,

Mr. Matthews moved to amend said bill by striking out in the 1st section, all after the words 'be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,' to the end of said section, and inserting in lieu thereof, the following,

'That in all the counties of this State, where the Magistrate' Courts are not organized in each Election District in such county, the county courts thereof shall have and pos-
