authorised to negotiate on the faith of the State, a temporary loan or loans, for such sum or sums of money as he may find necessary to meet the demands upon the Treasury during the current year, not exceeding in the whole fifty thou-

sand dollars.

Resolved, that the Treasurer be, and he is hereby directed to distribute to the several countres in this State, the whole proceeds of the tax of twenty cents on every hundred dollars of the capital stock of the several banks, whose charters were, by the act of December session 1821, extended to the 1st of January 1845, and again further extended by the act of December session 1834, chapter 274, which has been received and not distributed, or may hereafter be received from said banks, in the same manner and proportions, as provided for and required by the act of December session 1816, chapter 256.
