Which was read the first, and by special order the second time, assented to and sent to the senate.

Mr. McMahon, submitted the following resolution,

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, that the Treasurer of the *Western Shore* of Maryland, pay to Ann Mudd, widow of Bennett Mudd, late a sergeant in the revolutionary war, in quarterly payments, a sum equal to the half pay of a sergeant, during her natural life, in consideration of the services of her said husband, in the said revolution.

Which was read the first, and by special order the second time, assented to, and sent to the senate.

Mr. McMahon submitted the following preamble and resolution,

Whereas, by resolution No. 93, of the December session 1835, of the General Assembly of Maryland, the Treasurer of the *Western Shore* of Maryland, was directed to pay to Jane Miles, widow of Joshua Miles, an officer of the revolution, the half pay of a Captain, in consideration of the services of her husband, and whereas the said Treasurer has doubts as to his authority, to pay said half pay, for the want of the words 'during her natural life,' therefore,

Be it resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, that the Treasurer of the *Western Shore* of Maryland, pay to Jane Miles, widow of Joshua Miles, an officer of the revolution, or her order, the half pay of a Captain during her natural life, in consideration of the services of her late husband, and be it further resolved, that resolution No. 93, is hereby rescinded, except so far as that her half pay shall commence at the date of resolution No. 93.

Which was read the first, and by special order the second time, assented to and sent to the senate.

Mr. Duckett submitted the following resolution,

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, that the Treasurer of the *Western Shore*, pay to Edward Thompson the sum of twelve dollars, for three days services as extra committee clerk, to the House of Delegates at its present session.

Which was read the first, and by special order the second time, assented to and sent to the senate.

Mr. Duckett submitted the following message, which was read, assented to, and sent to the senate,
