Resolved in the affirmative.

The said resolution was then read the second time, as sented to, and sent to the senate.

The clerk of the senate returned the bill, entitled, an act for the promotion of internal improvement, endorsed with pass, ordered to be engrossed,

And, delivered a bill originated in and passed by the senate, entitled, an act to authorise the shutting up a certain road within the city of Baltimore,

Which was read and referred to Messrs. McLean, Rich-

ardson and Ely.

Mr. Beam, from the select committee, made a favorable report upon the bill from the senate, entitled, an act to authorise John Mullen, to take and use the name of Samuel Milford,

Which was read.

The said bill was then read the second time by special order, passed and returned to the senate.
