The clerk of the senate returned the resolution in favour

And, delivered a bill, originated in and passed by the  
senate, entitled, an act to authorise the removal and discon-  
tinuance of a certain Draw-bridge in the city of Baltimore,

Which was read and referred to Messrs. McLean, Ely  
and Iglehart.

Mr. McLean, from the committee, made a favorable re-  
port upon said bill,

Which was read the first time;

The said bill was then read the second time by special  
order, passed and returned to the senate.
