

Mr. Iglehart, from the committee on claims, reported a bill, entitled, an act for the payment of the Journal of accounts,

Which was read the first and second time by special order, passed and sent to the senate.

Mr. Iglehart, from the same committee also, delivered the Journal of accounts,

Which was read the first, and by special order the second time, assented to, and sent to the senate.

The clerk of the senate returned the bill, entitled, an act supplemental to an act to establish Magistrates' Courts in the several counties of this State, and to prescribe their jurisdiction, passed, at December session 1835, endorsed, 'will pass with the proposed amendments,'

Which amendments were severally read the first and second time by special order, severally assented to, with the exception of the first amendment, which was rejected by the house.

Mr. Winder submitted the following message, which was read, assented to, and sent to the senate.
