That is appears to your committee, by the books and accounts of faid treasurer, he hath received on loan, from the 27th of July last to the 11th of August inclusive, for which state certificates have been isseed and examined by your committee, amounting to f. 2,933 2 6; from the sheriffs of the several counties for taxes, f. 37,511 19 11; for vessels sold, f. 16,318 8 5; and from the treasurer of the eastern shore the sum of f. 35,697 15 9; the sum of f. 105 hath been received for marriage licences; for militia sines the sum of f. 188 6 3; and sor money returned from recruiting officers and sundry other persons the sum of f. 7,282 15 10.

Your committee find, that the said treasurer hath paid away for interest on state loan-office certificates £.3,849 12 1; for interest on certificates issued agreeable to an act of assembly, enatitled, An act for the payment of the journal of accounts, and for other purposes, the sum of £.85 16; and to sundry claimants on the journal of accounts £.18,119 15.
