VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS, NOVEMBER; may judge superfluous, might be more usefully applied to the advantage of the state, that any fervices they are likely to render, are therefore of opinion, that is would conduce ingre to the real benefit of the state, to vest the governor and council with powers to dispose of the same, than to continue an unnecessary and burth asome expense to the public, without any probable expectation of an adequate return of services. All which is submitted to the consideration of the honourable binute."
