That out of the beforementioned sums, they have paid into the hands of the western shore

treasurer, agreeable to a resolve of the house of celegates, the sum of £. 12,378 17 42 tierling, and for office expences, including their and their cierk's salaries, the turn of L. 1,613 11 1 fir all which have been produced to your committee the necessary vouchers and receipts, and that there remains in the office a balance of £ 49.757 0 3 Herling.

That your committee have examined the teveral nends caken by the commissioners, in virtue of an act of affemely puffed at November session, 1769, for bills of credit, bills of exchange, and gold and filver, lent out on bond to fundry persons on interest at the rate of four per cent. per annum, and compared the same with a lift thereof now remaining in the loan-office, ready for the inspection of the honouras le houses, amounting to £. 28,655 10 sterling.
