On motion, Resolved, That William Paca, John Henry, and Joseph Gilpin, Esquires, or any two of them, be, and they are hereby nominated commissioners to meet the commissioners appointed by the legislatures of the several states of New-Hampshire, Massachusetts-Bay, Rhode-Island and Providence plantations, Connecticut, New-York, New-Jersey, Pennsylvania, Delaward, and Virginia, at the city of Philadelphia, for the purpose of considering the expediency and practicability of limiting the prices of merchandise, produce, and labour, and of agreeing to the same, should they judge it necessary, in such manner as may be best adapted to the situation and circumstances of this state; and that the commissioners appointed by this state make return of their proceedings to the next general affembly for confirmation, if deemed proper.

On motion, the question was put, That the second reading of the bill for the limitation of prices, be referred to the confideration of the next session of assembly? The year and nays
