

On Motion ^{Supplement} the Act to make the Rules of their
issues by Congress, and the ^{12th} of ^{the} ¹⁷⁷⁹ ^{acted} by Acts of Assembly and Resolves of the late
Conventions, a legal Tender in all Cases. Referred to Committee N. 3
A Petition of John Bond, of Harford County, was preferred and read the first Time and ordered
to lie on the Table.

Ordered, That the several papers relative to raising provisions for the Army be referred
till To-morrow.

The petition of Thomas Fontee was read the second Time and referred till the next Session of Assembly.
The petition respecting Kent County, Greenfield, and the petition of the inhabitants of
Charter Town, were read a second Time and granted, and leave given to bring in Bills
pursuant to the provisions of the said Petitions.

On Motion the Committee N. 6 enquire what Laws will expire with
the close of the present Session, and make report thereof to the House.

Ordered, That Mr. Goldsborough, be added to Committee N. 2. Mr. Chase to N. 3.

Mr. Norris to N. 5 and Mr. Bond to N. 6

Thursday March 11th 1779

The House met. All present as on Yesterday except Mr. Hughes. The Proceedings
of Yesterday, read. Mr. Digges, Mr. Evans, and Mr. Key appeared in the House.

Several petitions were preferred and read, and referred to Committee N. 4

Mr. Thomas Beale Warrington, Esq^r. from the Senate, delivers to Mr. Speaker the Resolves
of the Senate which was sent up by Mr. Deye and Mr. Sprigg thus endorsed "By the Senate
March 10th 1779: Read and reported to the House By Order Mr. Digges, Secy^r."

The same was sent to the Governor by Mr. Goldsborough.

A petition of sundry of the Artillery Men in the City of Annapolis was preferred and read
the first Time and ordered to lie on the Table.

Mr. Jackson brings in and delivers to Mr. Speaker a Bill, entitled, A Supplement to the Act to
prevent distilling Grain into Spirit; which was read the first and second Time by special
Order, passed, and sent to the Senate by Mr. Beale and Mr. Norris

Mr. J. Beale from the Committee N. 6 brings in and delivers to Mr. Speaker the
following Report.

By the Committee appointed to report what Laws will expire with the
close of the present Session, unless further continued

Your Committee find, that one Act, entitled, an Act to prevent forestalling and engrossing,
and for other purposes therein mentioned, passed last Session of Assembly, will expire with
the close of the present Session.

That one other Act, entitled, An Act for enlarging the powers of the Governor and Council,
passed last Session of Assembly, will expire with the close of the present Session.

Your Committee further observe, that one Act, passed at a Session, begun and held
at Annapolis, the 11th day of March, 1779, and which is entitled, an Act,
for the relief of the said John Bond, will expire with the close of the present Session.
