The House met all present as on Yesterday except Mr. Hall. Proceedings of Yesterday were read. The House resumed the Consideration of the Petition of William Dovee, and referred the same for further Consideration till To-morrow.

Ordered, That no new Claims be received against this State after To-morrow, and that the Journal of Accounts be closed on that Day.

The Amount of Robert Denby was referred to Committee No. 2.

The Bill, entitled, A Supplement to the Act to raise the Supplies for the Year fourteen hundred and forty nine, was sent to the Senate by Mr. Polk and Mr. Letherbury.

The Bill, entitled, An Act to make valid a Deed from Edward Drennan of Prince George's County; the Bill, entitled, An Act to revive and aid the Proceedings of Caroline County Court, and for other Purposes therein mentioned; and the Bill, entitled, An Act for reviving and continuing the Actions and Proceedings in Worcester County Court, were severally read the first Time, and laid on the Table.

The Petition of sundry Inhabitants of Baltimore County, and the Petition of sundry Inhabitants of Frederick County, respecting the Reverend Mr. Booth, were severally read the second Time, and the
