The House met all present as on Yesterday except Mr. Bath. Proceedings of Yesterday were read The House resumed the Consideration of the Petition of William Moore, and referred the same for further Consideration till To morrow

Ordered, That no new Claims be received against this State after To morrow, and that the Journal of Accounts be closed on that Day.

The Account of Robert Denny was referred to Committee At 2.

The Bill, entitled, A Supplement to the Act to raise the Supplies for the Year from ten hundred and seventy nine, was sent to the Senate by Mr Polk and Mr Lottabury

The Bill, entitled, An Act to make valid a Deed from Edward Draman of Prince Georges County; the Bill, entitled, An Act to revive and aid the Proceedings of Caroline County Court, and for other purposes therein mentioned; and the Bill, entitled, An Act for reviving and continuing the Actions and Proceedings in Worcester County Court; were severally read the first Time and ordered to lie on the Table.

The Petition of sundry Inhabitants of Baltimore County, and the Petition of sundry Inhabitants of Frederick County, respecting the Reverend Mr. Book, were severally read the second Time, and the Question was put, That the following be entered as the Resolves of this House, Viz: On a second Reading of the Petitions of sundry Inhabitants of Frederick County and Baltimore Town, on the Behalf of the Reverend Mr. Book, Resolved, That the Disabilities, and Incapacities of preaching or teaching the Gospel, and teaching in <sup>public or</sup> private Schools, to which the said Mr. Book is subject, by Means of his not having taken the Oath prescribed by the Act for the better Security of the Government, within the Time thereby limited, be removed and taken off, on his taking, repeating, and subscribing the said Oath?
