The following Message was sent to the Senate by Mr. Bayly and Mr. Coramphill By the House of Delegates, March 19th 1779.

On Motion, Leave given to bring in a Bill, for amending and repairing the Roads in Harford County. Referred to Committee N. 6.

The Report on the Petition of John Clapham was read the second Time and considered with Matthew Tilghman, Esq. from the Senate, delivers to Mr. Speaker the following Message. By the Senate, March 19th 1779.

Gentlemen, we agree to ballot for a Register of Wills for Montgomery County, and have appointed William Hindman and Richard Barnes Esq. to examine the Ballot Boxes in conjunction with the Members nominated by your House. We have not any person to propose in Addition to the List transmitted. — By Order W. Whidgely, Secy.

Which was read: The House then proceeded to ballot for a Register of Wills for Montgomery County, and the Gentlemen appointed to strike the Ballots return and acquaint Mr. Speaker, that a Majority of Ballots appeared in favour of Thomas Johns. Whereupon Thomas Johns was appointed Register of Wills for Montgomery County.
