

On Motion, Ordered, That all Petitions and other Papers before this House at the present Session, on which no determination hath been or shall be taken, be referred to the Consideration of the next Session of the General Assembly.

On Motion, the Question was put, That the following be entered into as the Resolve of this House?

Resolved, Messieurs John Hanson, William Mardock Beall, and David Adam Tridner, or any two of them be authorised and empowered to agree with a fit and proper Person to translate into the German Language the following Acts of Assembly, viz: An Act for the better Security of the Government; The Apfelement Law; the Marriage Act; the Declaration of Rights and Form of Government, the Bill for the Relief of certain Conjurors, as now to be published for the Consideration of the People at large; the Militia Law; the Act to punish certain Crimes and Misdemeanours and to prevent the Growth of Foreignism; An Act to prevent excessive and deceitful Gaming; and that they or any two of them, be also authorised and empowered to agree with some Printer, to print 150 Copies thereof in the German Language, one of which said Copies shall be lodged with the Clerk of each of the Counties of Frederick, Washington, and Baltimore for the Use of the said Courts; and that one other Copy be furnished to each of the German Magistrates in every of the Counties aforesaid; and that the Residue of the said 150 Copies be lodged with the said Messieurs John Hanson, Beall, and Tridner, by them to be sold out to the German Inhabitants in said Counties, and the Proceeds arising therefrom to be applied to the Payment of the Expence of translating and printing the same. Resolved in the Affirmative.

On Motion, the Question was put, That Leave be given to bring in a Bill for the Relief of certain Conjurors therein named? Carried in the Negative
