Mr. Letterbury from the Committee appointed to take into Consideration the Memorial and Letter of the Chevalier D'Annois, Consul of France, brings in & delivers to Mr. Speaker the following Report.

By the Committee appointed to take into Consideration the Memorial and Letter of the Chevalier D'Annois, Consul of France to the General Assembly.

Your Committee have had under Consideration the Memorial of the Chevalier D'Annois, Consul of France, and also a Letter additional thereto, and beg leave to observe, that the subject matter of the same is of the utmost consequence to the commercial interest and prosperity of this State. As the Memorial and Letter involve several points truly interesting and important, your Committee from the nearly approaching Period of this Session, have not had time thoroughly to investigate a System properly calculated to carry into Execution the Chevalier's Idea contained in his Memorial. It is with the deepest Regret that your Committee find themselves, for the above Reasons, under the Necessity of procrastinating this Business to a future Assembly, especially as it appears that the last Sitting had determined to pay a proper Regard to the Chevalier's Application at their next Meeting. —

Your Committee are of Opinion, that the Attention of the Legislature should be drawn to this very interesting Subject at as early a period of the next Session as possible, when it may be discussed in a Manner suitable to its Dignity and Consequence, and that the President of the Senate and the Speaker of this House be requested to communicate by Letter to the Chevalier D'Annois the Determination of this House on his Memorial & Letter aforesaid All which is submitted to the Consideration of the Honourable House.

Your Committee beg Leave to report to the Honble House, That from the Examination of the Accounts and other Papers laid before your Committee by the said Joseph Affmond, it appears that there is a Balance due from this State to the said Robert Cummings of £ 9399 15 m 11 p Currency; which is submitted to the Consideration of the Honourable House. Resolved unanimously, That his Excellency General Washington is hereby fully empowered and requested to settle the Pay of all Officers of the Maryland Forces in the Continental Service in such Manner as to him shall seem most proper, and consistent with Justice, both with respect to Rank & Grade, and that the President of the Senate and Speaker of the House of Delegates be desired immediately to transmitt this Resolution to his Excellency General Washington by Express.
