By the House of Delegates March 25. 1779

Resolved, That the Governor, and the Council be authorized, empowered, and requested, to  
write to his Excellency General Washington, to cause the one half of the German Battalion,  
and also the one half of the Rifle Battalion, heretofore raised by this State to be incorporated  
into one Battalion, under the command of proper Officers, to be appointed out of those now in  
service; and that all the Officers of said Battalion, properly belonging to this State, be entitled  
to the One hundred and fifty pounds heretofore given to the Regimental and Staff Officers  
of this State, and be paid by the Governor and Council accordingly; and that the Officers and  
soldiers, so incorporated, be considered to all Intents and Purposes as belonging to the Maryland  
Line —

By the House of Delegates, March 25. 1779

Resolved, That the Officers who now are or hereafter shall be in the Maryland Line, and who  
shall continue in the Service till the End of the present war, shall, unless they should hereafter  
resign or be cashiered for Malconduct, be entitled to half pay during their Lives; and that the  
same commences at the End and Expiration of the seven Years heretofore provided for by Congress.  
Resolved, That the Widows of all such Officers as are or shall be entitled to the half pay as aforesaid,  
shall receive the same pay during their Widowhood, that their Husbands were or would have  
been entitled to.
