Matthew Tilghman, Esq^r from the Senate delivers to Mr. Speaker the Resolve respecting the additional Allowance to the Clerk of the Council, and the Resolve respecting the half pay of the Officers, generally endorsed; "By the Senate March 25th 1779. Read and assented to. By Order H. Ridgely (Speaker)"

Matthew Tilghman, and Joseph Nicholson, Esq^{rs} from the Senate, inform Mr. Speaker that the Governor is waiting in the Senate in Order to sign and seal the Laws passed this Session of Assembly. Mr. Hall, Mr. Craunbin and Mr. Quynn are appointed a Committee to review and correct the Proceedings before they are printed.

Mr. Speaker, attended by the Members, went to the Senate, where the Governor in presence of both Houses signed and sealed the following Laws made this Session, Viz.

- 1 A Supplement to the Act to prevent distilling Grain into Spirit
- 2 An Act for the Appointment of Visitors for Kent County School
- 3 An Act to prohibit the raising of Swine, Goose, or Sheep, in Chester Town in Kent County.
- 4 An Act to enable William Boodley and Arthur Boodley, Administrators of Stephen Boodley, jun^r late of Kent County, deceased, to sell and dispose of a lot of Ground in the said County.
- 5 An Act to continue the Act of Assembly for enlarging the powers of the Governor and Council, and for other purposes therein mentioned
- 6 An Act for reviving and continuing the Actions and Process in Worcester County Court
- 7 An Act to revive and aid the Proceedings of Carolina County Court, and for other purposes therein mentioned
- 8 An Act to enlarge the Powers of Ariana Ross, Executrix of Doctor David Ross, deceased.
- 9 An Act for the Establishment of select Vestries
- 10 An Act to continue the Acts of Assembly therein mentioned
- 11 A Supplement to the Act to raise the Supplies for the Year seventeen hundred and seventy nine
- 12 An Act for the Relief of Henry Stevenson, Sheriff of Baltimore County.
- 13 An Act for the Relief of Thomas Lightfoot, a languishing Prisoner in Talbot County Gaol
- 14 An Act for the Relief of James Bartlett, of Talbot County, and the Reverend Bartholomew Booth of Frederick County
- 15 An Act for removing sundry Original Papers in the late Prerogative Office to the several Orphans Courts in this State, and such original Papers lodged in the late Secretary's Office as relate to Suits in the General Court for the Eastern Shore
- 16 An Act for the Payment of the Journal of Accounts.

Mr. Speaker, with the rest of the Members, returned and resumed the Chair
