Whereupon Resolved, that John Perkins Stone, Jeremiah Townly Chase, James Brice, Daniel
Carroll; and John Brice Esquires be Counsellors.

Mr Thomas Eccleston and Mr Samuel Milge two Delegates returned for Douchester County, appeared,
and after being duly qualified they took their seats in the House.

Committee of Grievances and Courts of Justice; and they have Power to send for Persons, Papers
and Records.

That Mr. Frauffer, Mr. W. Stevenson, Mr. Wainor, Mr. Eccleston, Mr. J. Hanson, Mr. Burgess, and Mr.
Crampton be a Committee to examine and state the several Claims on the Treasury

That Mr. Jordan, Mr. Gresham, Mr. W. Mearns, Mr. W. Wilson, Mr. Alexander, Mr. J. Hanson, Mr. Hey,
Mr. Reed and Mr. Samuel Hanson be a Committee to receive and examine any Proposal for
the Establishment of Manufactories, and to consider and report the best Means for setting on foot
Manufactories, and promoting the Trade and Commerce of this State; also to enquire into &
report what hath been done by those who have heretofore received Encouragement for Manufactories.

That Mr. Dwyer, Mr. Lottsbury and Mr. Worthington be a Committee to enquire what Laws
have expired or will expire during the Session, or at the close thereof

Mr. Dwyer is desired to request the Reverend Mr. Hannah to perform Divine Service in this House
every Morning during this Session, at 9 O'Clock
