We join in Opinion with your Honours, respecting the public Conduct and Administration of the late Governor, and have appointed Mr. John Henry, Mr. John Hale, and Mr. Sotherby to meet the Committee of your House for the Purpose of drawing up a joint Address of Thanks

The Petition of the Justices and Register of the Orphans Court of Charles County was read the second Time and ordered to lie on the Table till the second reading of the Supplement to the tender Bill

The Petition of the Magistrates of Cecil County was read the second Time and referred until Friday next. The Petition of Ignatius Hader and Mary his wife was read the second Time and ordered to be considered on Friday next.

The Petition of Anna Maria Ringgold and Mary Ringgold was read the second Time and referred for consideration on Saturday next.
