

Which was read and concurred with, and Resolved, That this House will, on Friday next, resolve itself into a Committee of the whole, to take into Consideration the several matters mentioned in their Report. The House appointed Mr. George Barker (Committee Clerk). Ordered, That he be qualified to Mr. Biggs bring in his bill to establish a Kit, and a supplement to the act for the Establishment of Select Nations; which was read the first time and referred to him on the table. Ordered, That the Delegates of this State to Congress, who are in this City, be requested to attend this House on to-morrow, at three of the Clock, to give the House such information respecting the State of publick Affairs in Europe and America, as may be in their Power, and that one or more Members inform the Delegates that are not members of this House of the above Request. Mr. Speaker, in Consequence of the above Order, appointed Mr. J. Hall and Mr. H. Bass to give the above Notice.

Mrs. J. Hall and H. Bass report to the Honourable Speaker, that they have given Notice to the Delegates in Congress to attend agreeable to the requisition of the House.

Ordered, That Mr. Jordan, Mr. Worthington, Mr. Spring, and Mr. Hollas be added to the Marine Committee.

Ordered, That Mr. Doty Hugh be added to the Committee of Grievances &c.

On Motion, Ordered, That Mr. Wootton, Mr. Spring, Mr. Chaille, Mr. Brady, and Mr. Alexander, be a Committee to report the Contract entered into by the Superintendants for building the State House with Mr. Charles Wallace, and to inquire into and report whether the Contract hath been complied with by Mr. Wallace, and particularly whether the State House is well secured from any Damage from Rain, and for what Cause the Roof of Copper was taken off, and what has been done with the said Copper; and further that the said Committee enquire into & report whether the Galleries have been erected agreeable to the Contract made with Mr. Wallace.

Ordered, That the Order of the Day for taking into Consideration the petition of Robert Long, which was referred from last Session to this Day, be read, and it was read accordingly. Ordered, That the Petition be read, and it was read accordingly. On reading whereof, and on motion of this Council to give in Evidence a Certificate of the Clerk of the Land Office, and other Testimony, proving a fraudulent Conduct in the Principio Company, and their Managers, in obtaining a Patent for sundry Tracts of Land, including the Lands in Question, and which said Patent was obtained posterior to the several Resolutions which the said petitioner prayeth to be repealed, the Question was put, That the said Testimony be admitted? Resolved in the Affirmative.

The House having heard the Council on both sides, and the Testimony offered in Support of the Points alleged in the Petition, and maturely considering the same, granted the Petition, and leave was given to the Petitioner to bring in a Bill pursuant to the prayer of his Petition.
