

Mr Worthington from the Committee appointed to report what Laws will expire & deliver to Mr Speaker the following Report:

By the Committee appointed to enquire what Laws have expired, or will expire, during the Session, or at the Close thereof.

Your Committee find, that the following Laws have expired, and will expire in this Session, and at the Close thereof: An Act to prevent counterfeiting the Money of other Colonies, passed June Session 1773. Expired. An Act to regulate the Militia, passed June Session, 1777, and the supplementary Acts thereto, passed October Session, 1777, and March Session 1778. An Act for the Appointment of Inspectors, and for other Purposes therein mentioned, passed October Session, 1778, will expire the 30th of this Instant, and the Supplementary Act thereto passed July Session, 1779. An Act for the Regulation of Officers Fees, passed October Session 1778. An Act to increase the Allowance of Magistrates, and for other Purposes therein mentioned, passed October Session 1778. An Act to prohibit, for a limited Time, the Exportation of Wheat, Flour, Rye, Indian Corn, Prue, Kread, Beef, Lard, Bacon, Live Stock, Peas, Beans, Oats, and other Victual, passed July Session, 1779. An Act for the more effectual preventing forestalling and engrossing, and for other Purposes therein mentioned, passed July Session, 1779. An Act to continue the Act of Assembly for enlarging the Powers of the Governor and Council, and for other Purposes therein mentioned, passed July Session 1779. All which is Submitted to the Consideration of the honourable House

Tuesday November 23^d 1779

The House met. Present as on yesterday, except Mr Digges and Mr McComas. Mr Warren Dent, a Delegate returned for Charles County, appeared, and after being duly qualified, he took his seat in the House. The Proceedings of yesterday were read. Mr Bayley, Mr Craupind, and Mr Key, appeared in the House

A petition from Ann Stevenson, praying Permission to go to New York, to her Husband, was preferred and read the first and second Time by special Order, whereupon Resolved, that the Governor and Council be desired to request his Excellency General Washington, or the commanding Officer at Elizabeth Town, to grant his leave to Mrs Stevenson, with her youngest Child and a Negro Boy, to go into the City of New York, and to return; and that the Governor and Council be requested to grant their Pass to the said Mrs Stevenson to repair to the Commander in Chief, or to the Commanding Officer at Elizabeth Town, to solicit leave as aforesaid.
