Your Committee find, that the said Treasurer hath paid away, including his Salary to the 6th of November 1779, the sum of £35, 8/2... 18-3; for all which Sums have been produced the necessary Vouchers and Receipts; and that there remains in his Hands a Balance of £6, 9/5... 6-5 1/2 belonging to this State. All which is submitted to the Consideration of the honourable House

On Motion, leave given to bring in a Bill to enable the Justices of Frederick & Montgomery Counties to apply a Loan of Money sufficient to defray the Expence of the Commissioners in dividing Frederick County. Ordered, That Mr. Bayly, Mr. Keatty, Mr. Weston, Mr. Crumpton and Mr. J. Hanson do prepare and bring in the same.

The Bill, entitled, An Act relating to the County Courts of Caroline County was read the second Time, passed, and sent to the Senate by Mr. Drimmer & Mr. Mc Bride

The Proceedings of the Commissioners from the several States of New Hampshire, Massachusetts, Rhode Island and Providence plantations, Connecticut, and New York, held at Hartford on the 26th of October 1779; and the Letter from William Livingston, President, and Caleb Camp, Speaker of the House of Assembly of New Jersey dated Trenton September 29th 1779; referred to Mr. J. Hanson, Mr. Sprigg, Mr. Chan, Mr. J. Henry, Mr. J. Hall, Mr. J. Stevenson, and Mr. Fitzhugh, who are appointed a Committee to consider and report on the same.
