Mr. Daffin delivers to Mr. Speaker a petition of sundry Inhabitants of Caroline County relative to a Bridge, which was read the first Time and ordered to lie on the Table

Charles Carroll, of Carrollton, Esq. from the Senate, delivers to Mr. Speaker a letter from the Surveying Office, dated November 12th 1779, signed John Lyburn, Surveyor General, enclosing an Account of the Limitations with the State of Maryland, which were read and ordered to lie on the Table

The following Message being prepared, was sent to the Senate by Mr. J. Hall and Mr. Henry
By the House of Delegates November 29th 1779

May it please your Honours,
The proper Measures to be adopted to procure speedy and full Supplies of Food and Forage for the Army of the United States; by what Means a Quantity of Cloathing, Blankets, Shoes, and other Necessaries, can be obtained to furnish the Troops from this State; and the Recommendation of Congress of the 19th Instant, to the several States to enact Laws for the establishing & carrying into Execution a general Limitation of Prices; are Subjects of so great Moment, and require such speedy Determination, that this House are induced to propose a Conference on those Subjects, and should you concur with us in sentiment, we have appointed Messieurs John Hall, John Henry, John Hoffman, William Stovener, Peregrine Detholm, and Samuel Chase, to join such of your Honours as you may judge proper to name for that Purpose.

The House met. Present as on Yesterday except Mr. Worthington. The proceedings of Yesterday were read. Mr. Moore, Mr. Truelove and Mr. DeHalle appeared in the House

On Motion Leave given to bring in a Bill for the adjournment of Cecil County Court,
Ordered, That Mr. Chase, Mr. Doye, Mr. Beatty and Mr. Detholm, do prepare and bring in the same

Ordered, That the Clerk write to the several absent Members, informing them that their immediate Attendance is required in the House

Ordered, That the Clerk of the House collect all the Votes and Proceedings of the House of Delegates and Senate, and the Laws which have passed since the Formation of the new Government, and get them half bound for the Use of the House

A Bill, entitled, An Act for the Relief of William Whiterost, of the City of Annapolis, was read the first Time and ordered to lie on the Table

The House being informed that the late Sheriff of Anne Arundel County was attending, agreeable to the Order of Monday the 22nd Instant; Ordered, That he be called in; and he appearing at the Bar accordingly, and producing a Receipt from the Sub Sheriff of Queen Annes County for thirteen Packages, dated the 22nd of September last, he was discharged
