Mr. M. Mechin brings in and delivers to Mr. Speaker a Report on the Petition of William Gibson, which follows in these Words

By the Committee appointed to report on the Petition Facts set forth in the Memorial of William Gibson, Clerk of Baltimore County. Your Committee beg leave to report, that having duly examined and considered the same, together with a Deposition of the said William Gibson, do find the Facts set forth therein, to be true, and are of Opinion, that the said William Gibson ought to be relieved by an Act of Assembly, agreeable to the Prayer of the said Memorial. All which is submitted to the Consideration of the Honourable House.

Signed by Order George Ranken, C. Committee. Which was read and the Question was put, that the same be concurred with? It was carried in the Negative and the Petition rejected

The Message from the Senate of this Morning, by Lepton Sherburne, Esq. was read the second Time; whereupon, Ordered, That Mr. Chase, Mr. Hall, Mr. Henry, Mr. Lehrsburg, and Mr. Spring do prepare a Message in Answer thereto.

The Bill, entitled, An Act to continue the Acts of Assembly therein mentioned, read the second Time and passed.

The Bill, entitled, An Act for the Relief of the Deceased Thomas Brown, of Dorset County, and the Deceased Joseph Mosinger of St. Mary's County, read the second Time and passed.

The House adjourns till Monday Morning 9 o'clock. Monday, December 15th 1779

The House met. Present as on Saturday except Mr. Crauford and Mr. B. Hall. The Proceedings of Saturday were read

The House took into Consideration the Amendments proposed to the Bill, entitled, An Act to enable the Corporation of the City of Annapolis to sell certain Lands &c. which being read through out, were agreed to, and the Bill thereupon passed for engrossing.

The Report from the Committee appointed to enquire into the Conduct of Pinchaps &c. read the second Time; whereupon Ordered, That a Copy of the said Report, with the Papers referred to in the same, be made out and transmitted by the Clerk of the House to the Attorney General, who is hereby directed to take the most effectual Measures for prosecuting all such Offences mentioned in the said Report.
