

Caron, not having any of the said Articles for Sale, to be called in by the said Commissioner". After the word "Price", in the 4th Line from the Bottom of the 5th Page, insert the words "fixed on as aforesaid". Strike out from the word "kept", in the 7th Line of the 5th Page to the Bottom of the 6th Page. After the word "don", in the 10th Line of the 7th Page, strike out to the End of the Paragraph, and insert the following, "and the Price agreed to be paid therefor." Which were read & agreed to & the Bill ordered to be engrossed.

And the Bill, entitled, An Act to prohibit the going at large of swine and geese in Baltimore Town in Baltimore County, endorsed "By the Senate December 26th 1779. Read the first & second Time by especial Order & will pass By Order of the Senate. Ordered to be engrossed.

On Motion, the Question was put That £1000 of Ammun be allowed to the Judge of the Court of Admiralty? Carried in the Negative

The Question was then put on £3000 of Ammun. Resolved in the Affirmative

On Motion, Resolved, That the Clerks of the two Houses be allowed each the same of their Allowance, and Incident Charges, for their Attendance in Time of Session, as the Members of the General Assembly, and a salary each at the Rate of £2000 of Ammun, for their Care of the Papers belonging to their respective Houses, and making up two Journals each Session, one for the Printer and the other to be recorded. Ordered That the Clerk provide a Record Book for the Purpose of entering the Proceedings

Resolved, That an Allowance of £1500 of Ammun be ~~allowed~~ made to the Mesenger to the Governor and Council. The House adjourns till to Morrow Morning 9 O'Clock

Monday, December 27th 1779

The House met. Present as on Yesterday, except Mr Crauford and Mr. Delahugh. The Proceedings of Yesterday were read. The engrossed Bill N^o 32, read & assented to & sent to the Senate, with the Paper Bill thereof by Mr Jordan & Mr. Westonsen.

Mr. Westonsen brings in & delivers to Mr. Speaker a Bill, entitled, An Act for the Relief of certain Nonjurors; which was read the first Time & ordered to lie on the Table

On Motion, the Question was put, That the following be entered as the Order of this House, to wit; That Mr. Hall, Mr. Chase & Mr. Duym, be appointed to contract for the making seats in the Gallery, and for the erecting seats under the Gallery, which are to be appropriated for the Use of the Governor, the Members of the Senate, and the Council, the Chancellor and Judges, when they think proper to attend any public Debate?
