In Council of Safety Annapolis March 23rd 1776

Sir.

We have been informed that you have a quantity of coarse blankets that are very suitable for the Soldiers who are in great want of that necessary article and are afraid it will be some time before we shall be able to provide them and that the Soldiers in the mean time may suffer very much for want of them. Under these circumstances of the zeal you have manifested in the Cause, we make no doubt but that you will readily spare all you possibly can notwithstanding you may have laid them aside for the use of your own Family. Will please to write us another Dispatch by the first opportunity and acquaint us what Blankets you may think proper to supply the public with and the price, for which we will send you an order on the Treasury and order them directly here.
