Sir.

We received a letter yesterday from Mr Lux advising us of your having cast and bored 1-
18 pounds and that you expected to have four more finished by this time. Our Board have
appointed Capt Ringo to prove them and desire you will forward them to Baltimore as fast as
you can get them ready to send off as they are greatly wanting there.

To Mr Danl Hughes.

Sir

We send you inclosed Commr. to fill up Capt Waring's Company and shall do the
same by Capt Richardson, when you transmit us the name of a proper person for Ensign. We send
you also an order on the Treasury for \$300.0 for which you will hereafter render an account. It
will serve to pay for wood, candles, expences &c.

We apprehend you have not much more than one Ton of powder remaining at
Bladensburg, part of which will be ordered soon to Piscataway, some part left where it is and the
remaining will be adered up to our Magazine in the neighbourhood of Annapolis now getting
ready. In the mean time we desire you would keep a guard of six men, to relieve each other,
two only we think sufficient to be on duty - their pay and rations the same as when in actual
service; upon which plan you are to make out the acc'ts of the attendance of the Guard
herefore.
