

Baltimore November 14-1776

Sir.

I sent you by a Schooner yesterday 100 bbls of Bread and 18 Casks of Powder for Colonel Hore and a guard with the Order to Carry your Salt. But the Boat to the Point to take in the Salt as I thought But went off with out taking it and I fear much to your Regard But you may depend that it shall come with the next Boat we are going on as well as the Case I hope the Revolution will be with you Sunday next and the Schooner Friendship by the Middell of next week the Brig is here done and ready for Flour the Butchers are salting the Beef the sales are making for such as want Small Sails and things are going tolerable But the Consumption of Cash is great with so many Sundry Things doing. Please send a sum of Money by the Bearer Capt Stone I will do all I can for you and remain your Humble Servant.

Sir.

We are informed by your Favor of the 8th Inst. and upon the strictest Enquiry cannot find that any Indians of the Six Nations are detained in Maryland contrary to their Inclinations. Two or three Strangers came and joined the Antislavery Indians some Time ago who still remain with them satisfied and well treated - therefore the Idea cannot be founded in truth and we are sorry it should create any uneasiness among the Indians - In compliance with the request of the Board of War, we enclose you a list of the Officers of Continental Troops raised in this State with the ranks, dates of commissions & number of privates, which we hope upon examination will be found right.

The sum you enclosed a bill of Lading for some powder arrived in Capt. Hill at Baltimore Town, which we have requested Mr Isaac Van Hook to have taken care of until you give orders about it - The Bill of Lading and letter to Thomas Mifflin Esq. came under cover to us - please to forward the Letter.
