James Christie Esq. of Baltimore Town attend this Convention on Saturday next to answer a complaint exhibited against him before the Committee of Observation for Baltimore County, and referred by the Continental Congress to this Convention for their determination. On motion Resolved, That an alteration be made in the Resolve of December Convention, relative to the killing of Lamb.

Resolved, that the resolution of this Province "that no person ought to kill Lamb, dropt before the first day of May yearly, or other Sheep, after the first day of January then next, under four years of age" be repealed so far as relates to killing of Lamb; but it is earnestly recommended that the Continental Resolve respecting the killing of sheep be most strictly observed.
