

Copy of Letter N^o 15. was sent to the Committee of Observation for the Middle District of Frederick County.

Ordered, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Cumberland Ouzar of Baltimore Town one hundred and fifty Pounds Common Money for Demurrage and Detention of Schooner 92.

Ordered, That the Schooner 92 be unloaded as soon as can be done with Convenience under the Care and Direction of Mr. Cumberland Ouzar, and further

Ordered that the same be lodged in his Warehouse, and that he cause such of the Flour as may be in danger of being spoiled to be baked into bread for the use of the public.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Francis Smyth forty three Pounds ten Shillings Common Money for leather breeches for the Troops.

Ordered, That the said Treasurer pay to Capt. John Fulford nine Pounds five Shillings for Leather Breeches.

Ordered, That the said Treasurer pay to John Greenetta of Baltimore four two hundred and twenty five Pounds on account of his Contract for Cartouch Boxes.

Ordered, That the said Treasurer pay to Capt. John Day Scott for the use of Capt. John Gurby thirty Pounds three Shillings Common Money.

Copy of Letter N^o 16, was sent to Lieut. Will^m Harrison.

Ordered, That the Treasurer of the Eastern Shore pay to Dr. John Hindman forty six pounds nine Shillings and three pence for attending Capt. Hindmans Company.

The Council of Safety agree with Dr. John Hindman of Talbot County to pay him at the rate of one hundred Pounds per Annum for providing Medicine for, and attending Captain James Hindmans Independent Company of Regular Troops.
