

The Proceedings of the Committee of Observation for Charles County, against Cornelius Hogen, together with the said Cornelius Hogen in Custody, were transmitted to that Board; which being read it was thereupon ordered that he be committed to the Custody of a Guard to be appointed by Col. Trullinger until the further Order of the Council.

Ordered That the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Lieutenant Benjamin Had twenty three Dollars and six pence for services rendered in various Orders to Bladenburg.

Ordered that the said Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to the Committee of Observation for the Middle District of Frederick County one hundred and Common Money on account of the Expenses from both Counties.

Adjourned till next day 11 O'Clock.

Thursday 12th June 1776.

Met according to Adjournment. Present the same Members as on yesterday.

Cornelius Hogen, being ordered to be brought under guard before the Board, was brought accordingly. And the said Hogen acknowledging great Contrition for his Offence. It was ordered that he be discharged upon his Acknowledging as follows.

For Cornelius Hogen and William Richardson. Richard for me generally acknowledge myself to thank indebted to the Executive Council of the Province for the President of the Council of the County of Maryland in the sum of one hundred pounds. I am well to be served of you goods and Chattels Lent. and to be served in case the said Cornelius Hogen shall not conform to the Rules and Regulations of the Convention of the Province and Conduct himself in all things agreeable thereto in twelve months hereafter.

The said Cornelius Hogen and William Richardson acknowledge themselves to be Content.

Ordered, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Col. William Richardson twelve pounds Common Money for the use of Henry, Lewis and for his services two Months ending 10th Instant, as Adjutant to Colonel Richardson's Battalion of Militia.

Ordered, That the said Treasurer pay to Mr. Robert Curran one hundred and Pound Common Money on account of the Schooner Association.

Ordered, That the said Treasurer pay to Mr. William Lewis five hundred Pound like Money on account of the said Schooner.

Copy of Letter W. 22 was sent to Robert Alexander Esquire.

Adjourned till next day 10 O'Clock.

Friday 14 June 1776.

Met according to Adjournment. Present the same Members as on yesterday.

Ordered, That the Company of Officers deliver out of the Magazine the Ammunition to the Militia and when the Militia shall be returned to the Magazine the Ammunition shall be returned to the said Company.
