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to the care of his Excellency Robert Eden Esquire.

In consequence of the proceeding of the Committee of Observation of Calvert and Ann Stun del Countess William Waller of the City of Annapolis was brought before this board, and the charge against him being read and considered. It was thereupon ordered, That he give security in the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds, for his appearance before this board on the third day of July next and for want of such security, that he be committed to the custody of a Ward to be appointed for that purpose.

Mess^{rs}. Cornelius Funston and William Stoke appeared before this board and together with the said William Waller voluntarily recognize as follow and severally acknowledge themselves to be the worth content.

You William Waller Cornelius Funston and William Stoke do severally acknowledge yourselves to stand indebted to the Honble Council of St. Thomas Senifer Esq. President of the Council of Maryland in the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds Currency each to be levied of your goods and chattels, lands and tenements, in case the said William Waller shall not appear before the Council of Safety on the third day of July next to answer such charge, as shall be then and there exhibited against him and not depart without leave of said Council.

Ordered, That Subpoenas issue for David Hunter Senior and David Hunter Junior of Calvert County, to testify and declare their knowledge of and concerning the conduct of a certain William Waller of the City of Annapolis on the third day of July next, who stands charged of attempting to convey intelligence to Lord Dunmore.

Mr. Smyth withdrew from the Council of Safety. - and a new plan for constructing Row-Ballies, or Gondolas having been laid before the Convention, and approved of by them, and Mess^{rs}. Stewart and Balloway and Thomas Smyth not being able to complete the building seven vessels in time, it is agreed by consent of all parties, that the former Contract be dissolved, and a new agreement is this day entered into as per the written Contracts filed.

Mr. Hands has leave of absence.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Thomas B. Hands Esq. twelve Pounds, twelve Shillings, for 18 Days attendance, as a Member of the Council of Safety.

Copy of Letter N. 44 was sent to George Montague Esq. Commandant of the Ferry Ship of War.

Ordered That the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Mess^{rs}. Senifer & Hove twenty two pounds ten Shillings, on acct. of sloop Molly.

Ordered That said Treasurer pay to said Senifer and Hove the further sum of one hundred and forty pounds for Freight of Powder &c on acct.

Adjourned till next Day 10 o'clock.
