Complaint being made to this Board that General Stephens from Virginia had impressed a Pilot of Annapolis, and confined him with a view of obliging him against his will and inclination to pilot the vessel of the said General Stephens to the Head of Elk in this State, the attendance of General Stephens was by them requested, who in consequence thereof waited on the Board, when Mr. (Vice-President on their behalf informed him that such Conduct was contrary to the laws of this State, and an infringement of the rights of the Inhabitants thereof, that if General Stephens, or any officer of the United States did, or should stand in need of any assistance from us, we should exert ourselves to the utmost in procuring it, but that it became our duty, on Complaint to take notice of
