Troops would render the greatest service, so we should be glad
if the Committee of Observation would take the Matter into
Consideration, and give us their Sentiments upon it, and as on
all Probability we shall approve of the Station recom-
mended by them, we would have the Captain engage proper
and necessary Houges there immediately. As Bedding is an
extreme scarce Article; where we have had an Opportunity,
we have desired the Captains of the several Companies to
endeavour to furnish their Men with new Blankets, but
where they were not to be had, with such as could be
got in the Neighbour hood tho' a little worn, upon reasonable
Terms, the men not exceeding 15/- or the others 12/- - If
Captain Gunby's Men are yet unprovided, we would have
him adopt that Method as the best under our Circumstan-
ces, & will answer his Drafts for them.

It is very ambiguous from any Thing that appears
in the Proceedings of the Convention, who are to find Fuel
for the Troops, and as we conceive the Captains respectively
can most advantageously provide that necessary
