Gent^{rs}. Mess^{rs} Wickham, was apprehended and
brought before us Yesterday, in consequence of a Letter from Mr.
Sam^l Thayer to Mess^{rs} Wallace and Davidson, setting forth
that the said Wickham, was a Person inimical to the Libe-
ties of this Country and was suspected of being on his Way to
Lord Dunmore in As the Trial of Wickham, before
our Board would at this Time interfere with Business
of great Importance to the Province and as the Witnesses
on both sides reside on the Eastern Shore, we have thought
proper to send him under the Custody of Lieut^t Trajise
to your Committee, in Order that you may try and
determine the Truth of the Offence laid to his Charge,
You will therefore proceed to make the proper
Enquiry into this Matter, and conduct yourself therein
as you shall judge most conducive to the Public
Good.
