Polity of this, or any other Province, and knowing we are
supported by the Deputies of the late Convention - if
unhappily however they do not approve our Conduct,
we are determined to call a Convention with all convenient
Speed and lay our whole Transactions before them, that they
may judge of the Propriety of what we have done. -
