we write to the President by this Opportunity, and  
we think ourselves fortunate in having Mr. P. with us,  
and approving of all we have done, and we doubt not  
you <sup>would</sup> have acted in Substance, as we have done, had  
you been here on the Spot - our Council consisting of  
D. J. C. J. H. A. R. & J. T. were unanimous in their Opinion,  
and if we are suffered to go on our own Way, all will end  
as it should do - if on the other Hand the Governor  
is treated with the Ignominy and Rigour, and laid under  
Arrest, and guarded <sup>up</sup>, we cannot tell what will be  
the Consequences - this we are certain of, our Government  
will be shaken to its very Foundations, and in what  
Time it would be settled again we know not. -
