Letters, and sent Copies of all such Papers, as was  
thought material; — the Governor voluntarily gave  
us his Parole in the fullest Manner, and has  
since confirmed it by Letter, assuring us that he  
will not leave the Province till the Convention  
sets; we are firmly persuaded he will not stir,  
or do any Thing against the Peace thereof — he  
also assured us in the most explicit Terms, that  
he had received no other Letters from the Ministry,  
but what he gave us up and which we sent you  
Copies of; we examined his Bureau, and Closets,  
and found several Letters in them given to
