

Considerations some Days ago on the Impracticability
of Square-rigged Vessels escaping the Enemy in their
Way to their several Ports of Destinations did
conceive that small sharp-tugged Vessels would more
probably meet with Success - We have therefore
thought it most advisable to send the Cargo of
the Brig Fortune to the West-Indies in such
Vessels, and for that Purpose, have wrote to Persons
who, we are informed, can furnish us with them - in
the mean Time we would direct that the Cargo
of the Brig, should not be unloaded, but kept
on Board until you have further Instructions
from us - Captⁿ Hanbobby can't be much, if
any in Advance after the Arrival of the Hannah,
and the Bill he has drawn.
