Commodore Staines to Governor Eden (in consequence
of an intercourse between his Excellency and the
Convention) will inform you that a Man of War
may be daily expected up the Bay. We give you
this notice that the Militia need not be alarmed,
or unnecessarily drawn out upon duty on sight of
these vessels. We make not the least doubt but
that you will give the orders necessary for preventing
any insult being offered, either on her passage up
or down the Bay.
