Colonies, you will judge as well, or better than our
case. — we intend returning, them a short answer
and leave to the Conventions, when they meet again,
to give them the payment they deserve. —

Should the Congress think proper
to request us to march our militia, in the manner
of S. hath intimated, we must be under the
disagreeable necessity of calling the Conventions,
