you will conduct yourself with care and industry in  
the voyage. — if you are chased & find you must be taken,  
throw all your papers over board with weights to sink them.  
Should Mr. Van Robbey not be at St. Eustatius, or in that  
neighbourhood, you are to apply to Mr. Richd. Harrison  
at Martinique, and deliver your letter for Van Robbey
